

# Index

About the Index: Since this is my first attempt at writing a book it is also my first try at putting together that book's index.

Indexing isn't as hard as it once was; computers help—a lot. But I had to view each page and put "code" marks at every word I wanted to appear in the index. The publishing program (I'm using Adobe Systems Inc.'s **FrameMaker®** for those of you that might be interested) also allows me to compose the index entry with any text I choose.

After all chapters are coded, by selecting the right key-strokes I can "update the book" which will automatically generate a "raw" index. To make this raw material eye-appealing I enter the index file and "manage" the text. The result of all this is what you see below. I hope you find the index useful.

Something else weird: I index by FIRST NAME rather than last. That is because if I'm thinking about, say, John Hudspeth I don't think of him as Hudspeth, John. Same with phrases; look for the first word in the phrase you seek.
